OBJECTIVES AND CREDITS

The Course aims at promoting a culture of international cooperation among students, scholars and practitioners in the fields of urban design and management, by acquiring:

- The ability to interpret the contexts and interact with people and organizations of the Global South
- The specific ability to share the search for solutions to face the challenges raised by radical socio-economic, environmental and cultural changes caused by globalisation, above all the rapid and massive urbanisation processes in Countries of the Global South, which raise dramatically new problems of spatial and social inequality, as well as a new and difficult environmental challenge related to the climate change.

The Course offers to new generation of experts the chance to acquire skills and knowledge that will help them to develop an integrated and multidisciplinary approach to planning, design and management of urban settlements and territories in contexts with a high level of social, economic, territorial, and landscape vulnerability.

The rapid and overwhelming urbanisation processes in cities of the Global South for the most part lead in fact to an unabated growth of the so-called "informal cities", which are vast, illegal and unplanned urban agglomerations, where precarious housing conditions, environmental fragility and social and economic exclusion live hand in hand. This macroscopic phenomenon of urban sprawl involves mostly poor populations who have no access – or at least very little access – to even the most basic services, infrastructures, urban resources and typical rights of urban conditions. Besides, the urban sprawl create settlements with a very high rate of environmental and health risks and emergencies.

This is a city which is either excluded or at the margin of the consolidated city, not only from the spatial and social point of view, but also with respect to urban policies: despite the fact that informal areas are the only ones that the absence of housing and urban planning policies leave to urbanised populations, and not infrequently they are also the major part of the urban system, very often these places are not known or recognised and very often openly stigmatised by institutions and the public opinion.

Despite all this, these new and very hasty habitat tend to be the prevalent urban model in a large part of the world, the very "places where a good part of the future of the planet is at stake", and are thus the *true* urban management challenge of the coming millennium: a new field of investigation and intervention that requires innovative methodologies and approaches to spatial planning and to urban design, where the traditional methodologies and approaches used by cities institutions in the Global South are often imported in a stereotyped manner and used to "cover" market-oriented policies that increase social and territorial.

It is thus more than ever necessary to integrate the training of urban design, planning and management experts with a new kind of sensitivity and skills to allow them to work more efficiently in contexts with an elevated presence of informal settings, in order to reduce spatial and social inequality, resource deficits and environmental risks, and promote fairer, more sustainable and resilient development processes.

CERTIFICATE

Students will be expected to take part in at least 80% of the Course programme.

Students who wish to leave the Course, should do so giving the written reasons for their decision.

After passing the final examination at the end of the Course students will receive a Certificate of participation.

The final examination will consist of a presentation and discussion of a paper prepared at the end of the Course.

UNIVERSITY CREDITS

The Course is equal to 15 University Credits (CFU).

Students who attend a Master of Science in Architecture or in Urban Planning and Policy Design at Politecnico di Milano may use no more than 8 Credits in lieu of optional exams or no more of 6 Credits for curriculum internship in their study plan.

COURSE ORGANISATION

The Course will consist of face-to-face lessons and workshops organized in partnership with an international network of researchers, associations and cooperation activists.

More specifically, each module includes:

- FACE-TO-FACE LEARNING
 - theoretical-critical lessons held by Global South and/or cooperation themes experts
 - presentation of case studies/experiences (visits/meetings, presentation of texts/projects/good practices/videos)
- WORKSHOPS
 - practice of analysis, assessment, planning and design methods and techniques with the help of the Cooperation Workshop tutors
- INDIVIDUAL STUDY

ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

Students with at least a three-year university degree, individuals with Bachelor or Master of Science in Architecture, Engineering, Urban Planning, Design, Sociology, Economy and other scientific fields are eligible for this Course.

As for candidates who graduated abroad, equivalent study titles in their respective educational institutions will be considered.

The Selection Committee will select the students to be admitted.

The Course will be held only if a minimum of 15 students will enrol and pay the fee (or 25 students if they pay the reduced fee).

Students who have enrolled in another Post Graduate Programme or a Bachelor or Master of Science or PhD may also enrol in this Post Graduate Programme, but if they have enrolled in two Post Graduate Programmes and another study course, they will have to give up one of the courses.

By way of example the following are eligible for admission:

- individuals with Bachelor or Master of Science
- students with Bachelor of Science who attend a first or a second Master of Science (who are not enrolled in another study course)
- Ph.D students (who are not enrolled in another study course)
- Ph.D graduates and Specializing Master graduates
- Graduates who carry out professional activity

The following are not eligible for enrolment (by way of example):

- individuals without Bachelor of Science
- students of Specializing Master

SELECTION

The Scientific Committee will select the candidates.

Students who were born in a NON EU Country but who declare, in the application form, to have an EU Country citizenship, have to attach copy of an identity document from which the declared citizenship can be deduced. A copy of the stay permit will have to be submitted if a copy of the identity document isn't submitted.
